We have just completed another amazing year at the Capital City Education Alliance adding more space and programs to fulfill our mission.

In July, we moved to our new location, 30 Arbor Street, to provide us with a kid-friendly **SPACE** to conduct programming onsite (page 4). With the help of our students and several volunteer groups we transformed our dull, gray basement space into something sensational. I am always amazed at what a little paint can do to brighten a space. It is extremely exciting as we can now conduct afterschool, summer and school vacation programs in our building.

Having more space, allowed us to expand our **PROGRAM** offerings. During the summer we launched our *Broken to Beautiful* program (page 5). Students in 7th-10th grade joined us to learn about different aspects of running a business such as sales, operations, marketing, and finance. In addition, they learned about teamwork, compromise, and negotiation as they designed and painted a crate with a partner. Students created a unique thematic design and painted their crate. The crates are available for sale on Etsy at **CharityCrates**, if you'd like to purchase one. A portion of the proceeds support our programs and a percent goes back to the artists.

A special thank you to those of you who supported our two "fun" raisers to support CCEA (page 7). Our 3rd annual **Rawlings Golf Tournament** doubled our attendance and tripled our proceeds. We also had Hartford's first nonprofit **Silent Disco** at Spotlight Theatres Front Street in partnership with IHeart Media and Barings, our title sponsor. Participants danced to one of three tracks of music on their personal headset, enjoyed appetizers, drinks and bid on our auction items. Dates will be coming soon for the 2019 events. And finally, our volunteers and partnerships helped make all this happen. In 2018, 219 volunteers gave over 898 hours of their time to work with our students and transform spaces. 
